Key Dates
<p>1485 – Henry Tudor defeats Richard III at the Battle of Bosworth. Crowned Henry VII</p> <p>1509 – Henry VII dies. Henry VIII becomes king and marries Catherine of Aragon</p> <p>1510 – Catherine gives birth to Mary</p> <p>1532 – Henry VIII marries Anne Boleyn in secret</p> <p>1533 – Anne gives birth to Elizabeth</p> <p>1534 – Henry VIII creates the Church of England</p> <p>1536 – Anne Boleyn is executed. Henry marries Jane Seymour</p> <p>1537 – Jane gives birth to Edward</p> <p>1547 – Henry VIII dies. Edward becomes king aged 9</p> <p>1553 – Edward dies. Mary I crowned queen.</p> <p>1555 – 283 protestants executed under heresy laws</p> <p>1558 – Mary dies. Elizabeth becomes Elizabeth I</p> <p>1588 – Spanish Armada launched by Phillip II of Spain and defeated by English Navy</p> <p>1603 – Elizabeth dies. End of Tudor period and beginning of Stuarts</p>

Key Terms
<p>Catholic – Member of the Roman Catholic Church who believes the Pope is the head of the church</p> <p>Protestant – A Christian who does not follow the Catholic Church</p> <p>Primogeniture – Rule that the first born son of the King or Queen would become King upon their death</p> <p>Reformation – A division started by Martin Luther to reform the Catholic Church</p> <p>Ex-communication – Official expulsion of a member of a religious group by the Religious leader</p> <p>Divorce – The end or termination of marriage by law</p> <p>Heresy – A belief or idea that questions or opposes an existing belief or idea. For example, a protestant who believes the Pope is not an intermediary to God, are committing heresy according Catholic beliefs</p> <p>Monarch – Ruler of a country (King or Queen)</p> <p>Explorer – A person who travels to somewhere nowhere has been in order to find out what is there</p> <p>Galleon – A large sailing ship</p> <p>Armada – a fleet of warships</p> <p>Circumnavigate – Travel all the way around something</p>
