Minutes:

Wellbeing check.

All children reported they are happy to be back in school with their friends and are enjoying their lessons. Y6 are looking forward to the prospect of visiting the Anderton centre in the Summer term and other end of year activities.

Reflect back on the last meeting.

- DT in Learning for Life has been rolled out this half term and all classes are addressing the missed learning from last year.
- The children enjoyed their in-class Christmas celebrations.
- The re-opening of the computer suite is working well and children are enjoying having the use of laptops in class too.

Messages from peers: Playtimes: A few children have enquired about having a rota system in the summer term for all classes to have access to a section of grass to play on when the weather is dry. Other children have also asked if it would be possible for there to be a weekly rota on the trim trail/play park so that all classes could have a chance to use it again. The children have also asked if they can have access to the buckets of equipment at playtimes.

Learning for life ideas: The children would like there to be a focus on exercise and sport for Learning for Life in the Summer term to help get children more active. Some ideas included having sessions learning about a particular sport such as football or netball and incorporating our golden mile running. The children also

would like to use the wildlife garden again during Learning for Life and suggested a gardening focus in one of the groups. They would also like to take part in treasure hunts and quizzes during Learning for Life.

Thursday online learning sessions: The children think that these are a good idea to help them catch up and have more confidence in something if they have not grasped it in a lesson. There were some concerns about not being able to attend due to other commitments after school such as mosque learning and picking up siblings from others schools but on the whole the sessions are a good idea and are useful to most children.

Big Debate and Parliament Event.

School Parliament would like to take part in a whole school debate again – in the hall if possible in the Summer term – they are going to start researching topics to debate. The children were excited by the planned in events for Year 5 to have a question and answer session with a member of the House of Lords and Year 3 to have a virtual 'school trip' to the Houses of Parliament.

PE

School Parliament would like to keep coming into school on PE days in PE kits as they find it comfy, they don't have to change in front of one another and it means that they have longer taking part in their PE lessons. They have also found it easier keeping the cloakrooms tidy and don't lose their belongings! All children would like to have a new PE kit with jogging bottoms and a hoody so that everyone is dressed the same.

School Parliament have said they would really like to celebrate a sports day this year even if it means staying within class bubbles. It was also suggested that if after COVID we could begin to organise inter-school tournament e.g. football or skipping.

The children have also said they would like to have a sports coach working in school again as they enjoyed having a specialist teacher.
