Minutes of Meeting

1.

Mrs Postle revisited the letter 23rd February and discussed the logistics of return. *Please read the letter sent out previously for all information*

Asked parents for **Questions** on the return to school

Is SATS going ahead for Y6.

Mrs Postle was clear that there was no DFE requirement to complete official testing for Reception Baseline, Y1 Phonics, Y2 SATS, Y4 Multiplication test or Y6 SATS. Teacher assessment is the only requirement. If after a return to school, we feel it is appropriate to test children we will communicate this to parents beforehand.

Should children bring in workbooks if they have been at home?

Yes, especially Power Maths books – these have been invaluable during lockdown. Children can bring in their work that they have been doing at home but we will not have time to mark this work. Parents were very complimentary about Power Maths.

Mrs Postle mentions how the children at school were completing work in books at school that were separate to 'normal' books as we felt it fair that children should have as much as possible the same experience as they have had at home.

Are all children going to be getting interventions?

Mrs Postle talked about the intervention programme laid out in the Covid Catch up plan – please visit our website for the [March Version](#). Mrs P talked about children need Quality teaching, parental support and the desire to learn which we have at Beaumont.

We will be continually reviewing the children who are attending interventions before school, in school time and after school. This is to ensure all children's needs are met. Mrs P then talked about not overloading children and saturating them with information that they cannot physically contain and getting the balance right.

Will the music service be coming into school?

Visitors and teachers will be invited in and Mrs P will be following the roadmap.

If a child tests positive for Covid does school provide live learning?

No if it is isolated case. They will visit this site

If it is a **FULL** class bubble closure, two live lessons will be provided in the morning with activities for the rest of the day (a letter would be sent out relaying this).

A discussion about the government are expected to provide LFT for families – as soon as we know anything about this, we will inform parents about it.
