# Beaumont Vision statement






# Welcome to Beaumont Primary School!

- ▶ Your child is about to take a very big and exciting step into the world of school. It is important that this step is made as smooth as possible so that he/she can quickly become happy and secure in their new environment.
- ▶ Our aim in presenting this information is to give your child the best possible start and if at any time you are concerned about anything relating to your child, please do not hesitate to make an appointment/phone call to see either the reception staff, the Deputy Head Teacher or Head Teacher.
- ▶ Many parents ask the question, "What can I do to help my child before he/she starts school?" This information is intended to give ideas and information which I hope you will find useful. Learning starts long before your child begins school, and the home environment is one of the most important factors in your child's continued educational progress.



# How to help your child before starting school?

- ▶ Familiarise them with their new school. Look through the “Beaumont Reception book” together regularly as it will explain all the different aspects of school life in Reception class.
- ▶ Bring them to the “drop in tour” and to the “stay and play session” in July so they can meet their new teachers, new friends and familiarise themselves with their new classroom.
- ▶ Practice putting on their uniform over the summer holidays so they are ready in September!
- ▶ Practice eating with a knife and fork.
- ▶ Practice recognising and writing their name.




# Beaumont Parking



It is **really important** that we reduce traffic around school. We strongly encourage you to walk to school if possible. If you have to drive to school please park a short distance away from school and walk from the seven access points that are available to our parents and children.

**Parents are not allowed to park on the car park unless they are disabled badge holders**, and this needs to be agreed by the Head Teacher. We kindly request you do not park on Wendover Drive as this creates issues for our neighbours as well as creating a procession of traffic.

# Beaumont School Uniform



- ▶ Please encourage your child to wear the correct school uniform at all times:-
- ▶ White shirt or green/white polo shirt and green sweatshirt
- ▶ Grey trousers, Grey skirt/pinafore, green check or striped cotton dress in summer. Black shoes (not trainers), white or grey socks.
- ▶ Beaumont Book Bag





# P.E. Kit

- The children will wear a Beaumont tracksuit for P.E. sessions.
- They will have PE once a week in the hall or outside.
- On the day they have PE, they will come into school with their tracksuit on and wear it all day.
- The children also experience lots of physical activities as part of the rich EYFS curriculum each week.



# School Meals

- ▶ School meals are freshly cooked each day on the premises. We run a cafeteria service with choices each day. Each class is on a rota system, apart from Reception which has 1st sitting every day. When confirming your child's dietary requirements please note that we do not currently offer Halal food therefore, we need you to clearly indicate if your child is vegetarian or is able to eat fish and vegetarian food.
- ▶ Since September 2015 the Government has offered ALL pupils in Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 in state funded schools a Free School Meal (known as the Universal Infant Free School Meal). At the moment, we are unable to confirm arrangements for Sept 2021.
- ▶ However, if you would normally qualify for free school meals, as per the leaflet within your pack, it is important to register with the Education and Arts Department, Second Floor, Schools Services, Paderborn House, Civic Centre between 9.00 a.m. and 4.45 p.m. Monday to Friday or telephone 01204 333333. The school receives valuable funding for pupils qualifying for Free School Meals called Pupil Premium.





# School Meals & Snacks

You may also wish for your child to have a packed lunch. No glass bottles or flasks are allowed for obvious safety reasons. Your child may of course go home for his/her lunch, but this is discouraged as lunchtime is an important time for children to socialise together.

School will provide a healthy fruit snack in Reception each day. This is part of the government "5 a day scheme" for Reception and KS1 children.

Your child can bring their own fruit snack to school if you wish to so. Your child must have a water bottle in school each day - please make sure it's named.





# Emergency Contact

- ▶ If any information on the emergency contact forms change, particularly contact numbers, please inform school as soon as possible so that these important records can be kept up to date. This is particularly important for mobile numbers as a lot of school information is relayed by our Parent App (we will be in touch shortly about this) and text messaging service.
- ▶ If a different person is collecting your child, you also need to inform the school office.



# Medication in School




- ▶ Parents are responsible for providing the school with comprehensive information regarding the pupil's condition and medication.
- ▶ Prescribed medication will not be accepted in school without a completed Consent or Health Plan Form completed and signed by a parent (these are available from School Office). We will only administer medicines within a normal school day where the dosage exceeds 3 times a day. We are unable to give any non-prescribed medicine to a child in school.
- ▶ All prescribed medication that children may need constant access to (i.e. inhalers) are kept in a secure container in the classrooms, out of reach of the children. All staff members have access to the containers and the administration is closely recorded. The school will not accept items of medication in unlabelled containers.

# Brilliant Behaviour at Beaumont!



- ▶ We use a “Good to be Green” system to promote positive behaviour.
- ▶ At Beaumont, we have three rights;
  - ▶ The right to learn,
  - ▶ The right to be safe
  - ▶ The right to be respected.
- ▶ We have superhero characters that promote the whole child! Each week we focus on a different character and have a celebration assembly where a child will receive a certificate and a badge.

## Class fund

This allows us to replace and replenish consumable resources and provide extended opportunities for your children. We ask for a donation of £1.00 per week.





## Drop in Day for Parents & Children

- ▶ We are hosting two days to give parents and children the opportunity to look around the whole school, meet some staff and children and find out more about the Beaumont family. We are offering a number of timeslots across the two days and would ask you to call the school office to book a slot. We are also offering a slot after school on the Tuesday, however, we strongly recommend that you attend one of the daytime sessions to enable you to see Beaumont Primary school in action.
